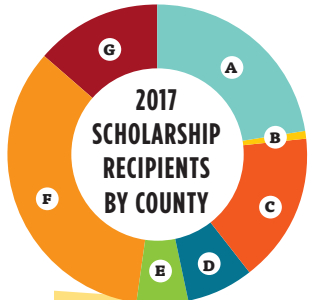


Scholarship Facts

Los Alamos Employees' Scholarship Fund

(LAESF) scholarships are awarded to deserving students from the diverse communities and backgrounds in the seven counties surrounding the Laboratory.

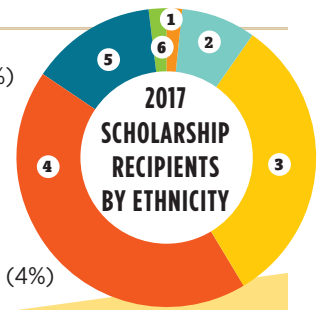
This year, a total of **144 students** pursuing higher education will receive **\$693,250** in awards from donors like YOU! **111 students** received LAESF four-year awards.



1 in 3 students who apply has received a scholarship.

- A. Los Alamos:** 25 students, \$143,750 (22%)
- B. Mora:** 1 student, \$10,000 (1%)
- C. Rio Arriba:** 18 students, \$86,500 (13%)
- D. San Miguel:** 8 students, \$50,000 (8%)
- E. Sandoval:** 6 students, \$30,750 (5%)
- F. Santa Fe:** 38 students, \$221,250 (34%)
- G. Taos:** 15 students, \$118,000 (18%)

- 1. American Indian:** 2 students, \$6,000 (1%)
- 2. Asian American or Pacific Islander:** 9 students, \$60,000 (9%)

SUCCESS

Since 1999, more than **\$6.1 million** in scholarships have made a positive impact on the lives of **1,200+ students!**

92% of all past LAESF scholarship recipients have graduated or are still in college.

73% of LAESF graduate students and **69%** of current undergraduates studied or are studying in a STEM-related major.

GENEROSITY

Los Alamos National Laboratory workforce has generously given more than **\$4.4 million** to fund scholarships since 1998.

Since 2006 **LANS** has contributed **\$3.2 million** and provided a \$250,000 annual match of employee giving to an endowment to build a sustainable program.

GROWTH

In 2016, **1,339 Lab employees** (15.2% of the workforce) **donated \$393,029**. In the last two years, opportunities for students have increased.

- » **\$237,750** total increase in scholarship awards
- » Silver award increased from **\$10,000 to \$15,000**
- » Bronze award increased from **\$4,000 to \$5,000**
- » **32 more scholarships** were awarded annually

EXPERIENCE

Many students jump-start careers through internships at the Lab, some return as full-time employees. This year, **38 scholars will work at the Lab as interns** with a mentor due to funding from the Director's office.

Additionally, 26 2016 scholars continued internships, and numerous past recipients returned for employment.
