

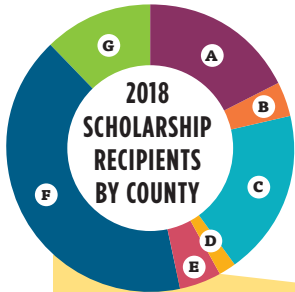
Scholarship Facts

Los Alamos Employees' Scholarship Fund (LAESF) scholarships are awarded to deserving students from the diverse communities and backgrounds in the seven counties surrounding the Laboratory.

In 2018, a total of **142 students** pursuing higher education will receive **\$712,950** in awards. **107 students** received four-year awards.

1 in 3 students who apply has received a scholarship.

- A. Los Alamos:** 19 students, \$108,000 (16%)
- B. Mora:** 4 students, \$40,000 (6%)
- C. Rio Arriba:** 20 students, \$88,450 (13%)
- D. San Miguel:** 2 students, \$15,000 (2%)
- E. Sandoval:** 5 students, \$28,500 (4%)
- F. Santa Fe:** 44 students, \$292,000 (44%)
- G. Taos:** 13 students, \$87,250 (13%)

SUCCESS

Since 1999, more than **\$6.8 million** in scholarships have made a positive impact on the lives of **1,400+ students** in Northern new Mexico, many of whom are **first-generation college students!**

GENEROSITY

Los Alamos National Laboratory workforce has generously given more than \$4.5 million to fund scholarships since 1998.

Since 2006, **LANS has contributed \$3.2 million** that includes a \$250,000 annual investment to build the endowment and a sustainable program.

GROWTH

In 2017, **1,012 Lab employees** (11.5% of the workforce) **donated \$417,602.**

An additional **\$70,000** was donated by **community members and local businesses.**

Growth in giving has meant increased scholarship opportunities.

EXPERIENCE

Many students jump-start careers through internships at the Laboratory, some return as full-time employees. This year, **38 scholars will work at the Lab as interns** with a mentor due to funding from the Director's office. Many scholars will also continue prior internships.
